BEFORE YOU START

- The **corresponding author/s** must collect and enter the following information for the abstract submission:
 - o Contact information: First and surname, rank, affiliation, affiliation country
 - Title: Full paper title for the presentation
 - 5 relevant keywords
 - An **Abstract** up to 250 words.
- Save your 250-word Abstract using this file name: **Surname_FirstName_TitleKeyword**



SUBMIT YOUR PROPOSAL

- To submit, **scan the QR code** to access the submission form.
- You will be required to provide an email address.
- The official Acceptance and Invitation Letters, Conference Program, and Abstract Book will be sent to this email address.
- Choose your preferred presentation formats: Oral, Panel, or Workshop.

REVIEW

 Your submission will undergo double-blind peer and a final review by the SICRI Advisory Board.

RESULT

Notification of results will be sent by mid-January. If your abstract is accepted, you
will be invited to register for the conference, and a Letter of Acceptance will be sent
to your registered email address.

REGISTRATION

 Submit your registration payment by the deadline. A confirmation email with your official receipt will be sent upon payment. Submissions will not appear in the Abstract Book unless you or a co-author register on time.
